The Five Basic Sentence Patterns The earth trembled Subject Verb (intransitive) The earthquake destroyed the city Direct Object (whom? or what?) Subject Verb (transitive) The citizens considered the earthquake a disaster Subject Verb (transitive) Direct Object (whom? or what?) Object Complement (noun or adjective)

Syntax: The Sentence Patterns of Language

- The first sentence is a declarative sentence, meaning that it asserts that a particular situation exists
- The second sentence is a yes-no question, meaning that asks for confirmation of a situation
- The difference in meaning is indicated by different word orders, ...

In addition to the three basic sentence patterns in ENGLISH SPEAKING, you will also need to teach, functionally, the imperative or command sentence such as "Listen," "Repeat after me," "Read this sentence," "Write this sentence," etc The nouns in ENGLISH SPEAKING have been selected on the basis of sound as well as on the basis of vocabulary

SPANISH SENTENCE STRUCTURES BASIC SENTENCE (SUBJECT + VERB + OBJECT) SENTENCE WITH "BACK TO FRONT VERBS" (ie GUSTAR) (CONT'D) (Usually, a compound sentence with a "Main Clause" and a "Subordinate Clause") (Subjunctive is used in the "Subordinate Clause") - THERE MUST BE A CHANGE OF SUBJECT TO USE THE SUBJUNCTIVE
