Making Connections Comprehension is “making meaning” of texts Texts, for the purpose of this document, include printed, visual, auditory, digital and multi-media texts Students find it difficult to comprehend or make meaning when they lack: • A repertoire of comprehension strategies • Background knowledge of the content
